BYLAW No. 3-2014

A BYLAW TO CONTROL THE USE OF BICYCLES WITHIN
THE VILLAGE OF LOON LAKE

The Council of the Village of Loon Lake in the Province of Saskatchewan,
enacts as follows:

1. Every bicycle being operated from dusk to dawn shall have a front reflector and a rear red reflector.
2. No person shall ride a bicycle without at least one hand on the handle bars.
3. No person shall be carried upon the handle bars or any other part of the vehicle in front of the driver of a bicycle.
4. No person shall ride or drive any bicycle upon any sidewalk or boulevard, the provisions of this subsection 4 does not apply to children's bicycles equipped with training wheels or children's tricycles.
5. No person riding a bicycle shall catch or hold on the side of any other motorized or non-motorized vehicle.
6. If the person is under the legal age the Notice of Violation will be delivered by mail to the parent or guardian of the person under the legal age ago with the voluntary payment.
7. No person shall:
 - Fail to comply with an order made pursuant to this Bylaw;
 - Obstruct or interfere with any Designated Officer or any other person acting under the authority of this Bylaw; or
 - Fail to comply with any other provision of this Bylaw.
8. A Designated Officer who has reason to believe that a person has contravened any provision of this bylaw may serve on that person a Notice of Violation, which Notice of Violation shall indicate that the Municipality will accept voluntary payment in the sum of \$50 (Fifty dollars) to be paid to the Municipality within fourteen days.
9. Where the Municipality receives voluntary payment of the amount prescribed under Section 7 within the time specified, the person receiving the Notice of Violation shall not be liable to prosecution for the alleged contravention.
10. Every person who contravenes any provision of Section 6 is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction;
 - in the case of an individual, to a fine of not more than \$10,000;
 - in the case of a corporation, to a fine of not more than \$25,000;
 - in the case of a continuing offence, to a maximum daily fine of not more than \$2,500.00 per day.

11. Bylaw No. 1/77 passed August 16, 1977, is hereby repealed.
