

VILLAGE OF LOON LAKE  
BYLAW 7/2014

A BYLAW TO PROHIBIT AND RESTRICT CERTAIN  
BREEDS AND MIXED BREEDS OF DOG

The Council of the Village of Loon Lake in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. In this Bylaw:
  - a. "Owner" includes:
    - i. a person who keeps, possess or harbors a restricted dog.
    - ii. the person responsible for the custody of a minor where the minor is the owner of a restricted dog.
  - But does not include:
    - iii. a veterinarian registered pursuant to The Veterinarians Act, 1987, who is keeping or harboring a restricted dog for the prevention, diagnosis or treatment of a disease of or an injury to a restricted dog;
    - iv. an Urban Municipality pursuant to the Saskatchewan Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals in respect of an animal shelter or impoundment facility operated by it,
  - b. "Restricted dog" means any dog, whatever age, of the following breeds or kinds:
    - i. Rottweiler breed of dog;
    - ii. Doberman Pinscher breed of dog;
    - iii. "Pit Bull dog" is defined to mean:
      - The bull Terrier breed of dog;
      - Stafford Shire Bull Terrier breed of dog;
      - The American Pit Bull Terrier breed of dog;
      - The American Stafford Shire Terrier breed of dog;
  - c. A dog of mixed breed or of other breed than above listed which breed or mixed breed is known as Pit Bull, Pit Bull dog, Pit Bull Terrier, Rottweiler or Doberman Pinscher.
  - d. Any dog which has the appearance and characteristics of being predominantly of the breed of Bull Terrier, Stafford Shire Bull Terrier, American Pit Bull Terrier, American Stafford Shire Terrier, any other breed commonly known as Pit Bull, Pit Bull dog or Pit Bull Terrier, Rottweiler or Doberman Pinscher.
2. No owner shall keep, possess or harbors a restricted dog within the boundaries of the Village of Loon Lake.
3. Any owner who keeps, possesses or harbors a restricted dog within the boundaries of the Village of Loon Lake is guilty of an offense and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding fee amount as set out in the General Penalty Bylaw of the Village of Loon Lake, and in default of the fine, to imprisonment for a term of not less than 7days, nor more than 30 days, unless the fine is sooner paid.
4. In the case of a conviction under the provisions of this Bylaw, the convicting Justice shall Order the convicted owner to cause the restricted dog, within 10 days of the date of the Order, to be removed from within the boundaries of the Village of Loon Lake.
5. This bylaw shall come into force and take effect on September 3, 2014.
